Cover Letter How-To

Notes: 1) <u>Tailor your cover letters</u> to each job you are applying for!!! 2) Cover letters should be ½ page to 1 page long. Less than half of a page usually doesn't give the hiring manager enough background to really understand your background and why you're applying to the position, but they also typically don't want to read more than a page. If your cover letter is longer than a page, try to cut out things that don't seem as important. The template below is for a *formal* cover letter, so if you don't feel it's important to include the company's address, or you don't want to include more than your city of residence on your own address, those may be two great places to start editing. 3) Seriously, tailor your cover letters!

First paragraph: Introduce yourself, where you found the job listing, your background, and briefly state your qualifications/past job experiences.

Second paragraph: Elaborate on why you'd be a great fit for the job. What makes you unique and stand out from other applicants? Include some of what is written in the job posting on qualifications, requirements, job duties, etc.

Third paragraph: Elaborate on your past work experiences and how they have impacted the way you work. Mention any skills that you did not write about in the second paragraph. If the job you are applying for is a stepping-stone into another part of your career, mention this and explain why the position will help you grow and attain that goal. Note: If you don't have a lot to say, you can combine the second and third paragraph.
